A' Firstfruits- The Resurrection has Begun (in Two Phases)

- 2. End (at his Parousia)

  - b. All Enemies Includes Death (via Resurrection)

- b' All Things Excepts God x.  
*God subjects all things* y.
- a' When the Son is Subjected to God
  - b') Penultimate-All Subject to Son x'
  - a') Ultimately-Son subject to God y'  
*God subjects all things*

1Cor. 15:20

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep.

1Cor. 15:21

For as by a man *came* death, also by a man *has come* the resurrection of the dead.

1Cor. 15:22

For as in Adam all are dying, so also in Christ will all be made alive -

1Cor. 15:23

But each in his own order:

Christ the firstfruits, then those who belong to Christ - in his coming presence.

1Cor. 15:24

Then comes the end, when he delivers the kingdom to God the Father when he has abolished every rule and every authority and power.

1Cor. 15:25

For he must reign as king until, "*he has put all his enemies under his feet.*"<sup>1</sup>

1Cor. 15:26

The last enemy being nullified is death.

1Cor. 15:27

For "*He\* has put all things in subjection under his feet.*"<sup>2</sup>

But when it says that, "*all things*" are put in subjection, it is plain that he is excepted who put all things in subjection to him.

1Cor. 15:28

Now when "all" things are subjected to him, then the Son himself will also be subjected to him who put "all" things in subjection under him, that God may be "all in all."
