

A. Faith>Hope: Knowledge of the Glory of God through Jesus

1. Faith: God's Creative Obj./General Revelation: Physical Light
2. Hope: God's Redemptive Subjective/Special Rev: Spiritual light (=illumination)
Gospel knowledge & hope of God's Glory
reflected (via indwelling Holy Spirit) from the glorious face of the risen Jesus

B. Faith: Jesus' Suffering & Death is Bodily Means to Manifest His Life

1. a. Heavenly glory in earthly mortal bodies of apostles
b. Purpose: Power (via Spirit of life & risen Christ) manifest as from God
 2. a. Apostles carry around the Suffering/Dying of Jesus in the body (but not mindset)

Summary: by grace, Apostles deny themselves & take up their cross

b. Purpose: Jesus' risen life manifest in the bodily lives of apostles

B' Faith: Jesus' Suffering & Death is Bodily Means to Manifest His Life

- 2' a. Death (via Suffering) working in living apostles for Jesus' sake
b. Purpose: Jesus' Risen Life manifest in apostles' mortal flesh
- 1' a. Death (via Suffering) working in the apostles
b. (Implied) Purpose: Life working in the saints

A' Faith>Hope: Knowledge of the Glory of God through Jesus

1. Faith: > Speaking/Preaching Gospel (> suffering/dying)
2. Hope: Correlated with Faith: Knowledge of risen (glory) through Jesus

- 1' All things (apostolic suffering/death) work for the sake of saints a'
- 2' Purpose: that the grace (apostolic dying/living faith via Spirit & risen Christ) multiplied by many converts in the eucharist, "*Thine own of Thine own, we offer*" may abound – leading to the Glory of God!

2Cor. 4:6

Brethren, seeing that it is the God who commanded, the light to shine out of darkness, the same also shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

2Cor. 4:7

But we have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the exceeding greatness of power is from God and not from us.

2Cor. 4:8

We are pressed on every way, yet not distressed; we are perplexed, but not driven to despair;

2Cor. 4:9

persecuted, but not forsaken; smitten down, but not destroyed;

2Cor. 4:10

always carrying around the putting to death of Jesus in the body, that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our body.

2Cor. 4:11

For we who live are always being given over to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our mortal flesh.

2Cor. 4:12

So then death is working in us, but life in you.

2Cor. 4:13

But having in us the same spirit of faith according to that which is written, "I believed, and therefore I spoke,"

we also believe, and therefore we also speak,

2Cor. 4:14

knowing that the one who raised up the Lord Jesus will raise us up also through Jesus and will make us stand together with you.

2Cor. 4:15

For all things are for your sake, that the grace, which is multiplied through the thanksgiving of many, may abound for the glory of God.
